MAYOR NORAMIE F. JASMIN AND HAITIAN LEADERS DISCUSS THE HAITI CHOLERA EPIDEMIC

Cholera spreads throughout Haiti, while Haiti struggles to recover from natural disaster.

Spring Valley, New York - November 12, 2010

Haitian leaders hold press conference in Spring Valley, New York November 16, 2010 at 2:00 P.M. in the Village Board Room. Leaders discuss the current health crisis with representatives of Good Samaritan Hospital and Rockland County Department of Health.

Haiti tops a list of the fourteen most disastrous earthquakes in the world; coming in fourth most disastrous with a death toll of 222,570, 300,000 injured, 1.3 million displaced; plus damages. Not yet able to recover from the overwhelming earthquake disaster, torrential rains, and constantly bracing for threats of other natural disasters; Haiti is now faced with a crippling outbreak of Cholera.

Spring Valley, having one of the largest Haitian populations in the US is finding ways to make a direct impact in restoring Haiti; structurally, emotionally, financially, and now physically.

The Village of Spring Valley:

The Village of Spring Valley is a very diverse municipality that embraces cultural differences. Mayor Noramie F.
