Mayors Against Illegal Guns

I, Mayor Jasmin, always believing in being proactive when it comes to public safety, partnered with over 500 Mayors from across America, by becoming a member of the coalition of Mayors Against Illegal Guns. My decision to join this coalition on February 25, 2010, was made with the safety of Spring Valley's residents in mind, as well as other communities that are affected by illegal guns.

In April 2006, an initial group of 15 mayors, hosted by Boston Mayor Thomas Menino and New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg, held a summit in New York City to discuss strategies for stopping the flow of illegal guns into America's cities. The Mayors attending the summit drafted and signed a Statement of Principles to guide their efforts, and the coalition was born.

The Statement of Principles that Mayor Jasmin signed, has been endorsed by major national organizations such as the US Conference of Mayors and the National League of Cities.

Cracking Down On Illegal Guns

Mayors Against Illegal Guns is dedicated to making America's cities safer by cracking down on illegal guns with these two primary commitments: enacting policies to keep guns out of the hands of criminals, and supporting the Second Amendment rights of law abiding citizens. A tip line allows residents to anonymously call local police departments with information about illegal guns.



The coalition has submitted a Blueprint which offers 40 recommendations for improving federal enforcement of existing gun laws in order to reduce gun crime and illegal trafficking. The 40 recommendations include: improving data and information sharing among law enforcement agencies; expanding analysis of gun trace data to identify gun traffickers and dealers who repeatedly break the law.

Reducing Crime In Spring Valley

During my tenure as a Village Trustee, Deputy Mayor, and now as your Mayor, I continue to have a successful partnership with the Spring Valley Police Department. Through this partnership, there has been great success in reducing crime in Spring Valley by 74%. I continue to stand firm in my commitment and promise for a better and safer Spring Valley.

New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg noted that, "Mayor Jasmin has joined the ranks of Mayors from around the country working together to make our streets safe and keep guns out of the hands of criminals". The Mayors Against Illegal Guns coalition now representing over 55 million Americans in more than 40 states, and we are excited to count the Village of Spring Valley among those committed to common-sense practices to reduce gun violence.
